We look forward to another exciting year, one that will be filled with exciting events, new outreach projects, and MORE!

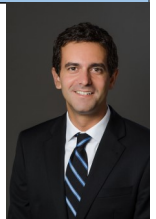

As I prepared to leave for my recent trip to Germany, which I will write about in next month's column, we all learned the extremely sad news that Dr. Jack Jones had passed away. As many of you know, my history with Jack goes back many, many years. As a 13-year old organ and piano student in Melbourne, Florida, I will never forget the first time I heard his brilliant organ performance at the First Baptist Church of Melbourne where my family were members. The occasion was the dedication of a small new 2 manual organ, and Jack played it like it was Notre Dame in Paris! Jack always rose to the occasion, and music was a privilege for him, in fact, the greatest privilege for him as his faith directed his musical endeavors. You could always hear this in his playing or conducting - a sense of Praise and Thanksgiving! My parents approached Jack after his organ recital and asked if he would consider teaching me. Amazingly, he agreed and thus began my first experience studying music with a world-class organist. After a year of taking lessons, Jack invited me to accompany several concerts with the Palm Beach Masterworks Chorus, which resulted in a European Tour that was fantastic.

Fast forward to the past several years where it has been my honor to serve as Jack's successor here at the chapel. I will give you just one indication of Jack's tremendous integrity and character. During his final few years as Director of Music at the chapel, Jack knew the organ console had worn out and needed to be replaced, but when asked about it by chapel leaders, he responded "I will leave that to the person who will follow me - that's the only right thing to do." Jack knew that it was in the best interests of the chapel to attract a new organist. I am so saddened that he was never able to perform a concert on the new organ console.

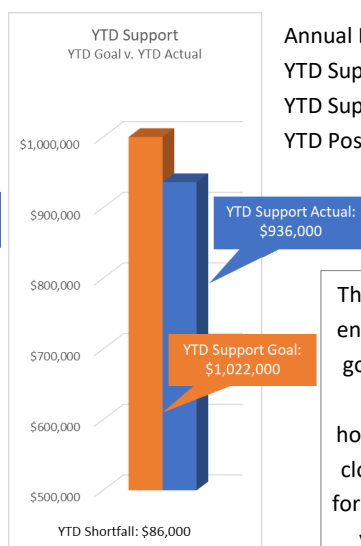
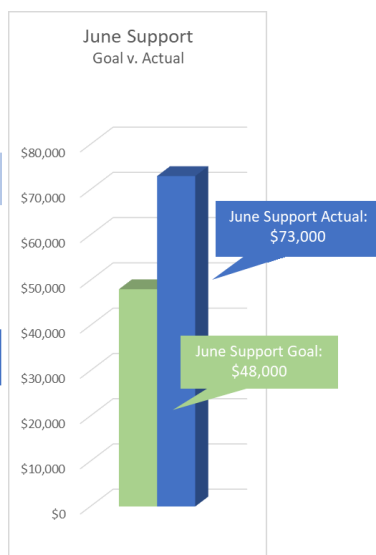
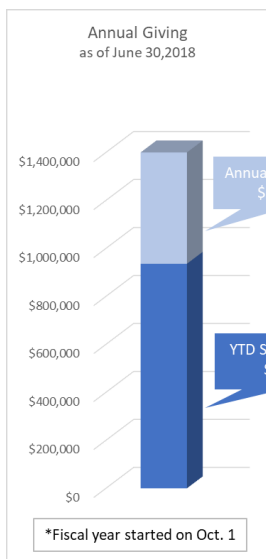
